## **Energy and the Mediterranean: a social dimension**

## Mediterranean Conference on Energy Casablanca – 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> of October 2009

On the 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> of October 2009, the International Association Droit à l'Energie SOS Futur and its Moroccan adherents, in partnership with the Ministry of Energy, Mines, Water and Environment of the Kingdom of Morocco will host in Casablanca (Rivoli Hotel), a Mediterranean Conference on Energy, two days of meetings and debates on energy issues in the Mediterranean region.

The greenhouse effect and climate change, mainly consequences of the nonrenewable types of energy production and consumption, constitute a serious threat to the region and beyond. These challenges require to the Mediterranean countries complementarily, working together, cooperation, solidarity and dialogue.
